



MAUREEN WOODS EDUCATION BURSARY

This \$5000 bursary was made possible by a generous donation from the Saskatchewan Provincial Library & Literacy Office (a branch of the Ministry of Education) and through the efforts of the Multitype Library Board and the Saskatchewan Library Association (SLA). Established in 2002, this bursary was created to promote the continued growth of professional librarianship in the province of Saskatchewan. SLA is honoured to administer this bursary.

MARY DONALDSON AWARD OF MERIT

The Mary Donaldson Award of Merit was established in 1977 to provide a bursary to a full-time or part time Saskatchewan student who is enrolled in a Library and Information Technology (LIT) Program offered by a Canadian post-secondary educational institution. The Mary Donaldson Award, along with the annual Mary Donaldson Memorial Lecture, was established in 1966 to honour the memory of Mary Donaldson, who was Saskatchewan's first Provincial Librarian from 1951 until her death in 1966.

The Mary Donaldson Award is supported yearly by individual members of the Association, library boards, library associations, library trustees and friends of Mary Donaldson.

SLTA LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Saskatchewan Library Trustees' Association (SLTA) confers an Honorary Lifetime Membership to a member or past member of SLTA to recognize distinguished service as a trustee in the library field at the local, provincial, or national level. The Honorary Lifetime Achievement Award was initiated in 1975 and since then has been awarded to many worthy individuals who have contributed to the establishment and maintenance of Saskatchewan's one-province public library system, which is the envy of the country.

SLA FRANCES MORRISON AWARD

Frances Morrison joined the staff of the Saskatoon Public Library in 1943 and was the Chief Librarian from 1961 to 1980. During the time she was with the library, she saw the library staff grow from 13 to more than 90. As Chief Librarian she directed the construction of two new branches, including the branch that bears her name. In 1981 she was awarded the Canadian Library Association's Outstanding Service to Librarianship Award. In 1999 she received the Saskatchewan Order of Merit for her contributions to library services in Saskatchewan. In 1982, Frances Morrison joined with SLA in creating this award. The SLA Frances Morrison Award is an award of merit for outstanding service to libraries given in the name of one of Saskatchewan's exceptional librarians. This award is open to all individuals, institutions or groups, and is not restricted to professional librarians or SLA members.

HONOURARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARD

The Honourary Life Membership Award is conferred upon anyone who has made a substantial and recognizable long-standing contribution to SLA and/or library service in Saskatchewan. As a member of SLA for life, the recipient has full voting privileges, does not pay annual dues, receives all association communications, and may serve on committees. As well, this membership entitles the recipient to discounts at all SLA functions and workshops.




